Cemetery concerns

In the previous edition of the Newsletter, in addition to the comments about the cemetery made on the page from the Parish Council, we published some basic information about concerns which had been raised by parishioners and mentioned two petitions which were at that time collecting signatures.

Our intention was simply to pass on news of matters which affect people within the parish, and we gave no opinion about the rights or wrongs of either the Parish Council or those who were airing their views.

However some on the Parish Council at their October meeting expressed displeasure at the article, and the Minutes of the meeting include "Cllr J Hill stated he

felt the piece regarding the Cemetery, directing readers to the online petition ill-considered given the abusive content of the comments on Facebook. He also felt that the editor could have given the PC prior warning of the article it intended to print."

In addition it was stated at the meeting that, as a major advertiser in the Newsletter, the Parish Council should be able to have some say in what was published in the Newsletter.

We would like to assure our readers that no advertiser has or will ever have any influence on editorial within the Newsletter, and we will always aim to give parishioners full information on any matter which we believe will be of interest to them.

What do you know about the Warne, Westcott, Thomas and Coleman families in Mary Tavy?

Mary Warne - who wrote up some of the history of Mary Tavy - and her husband Bill were very well known locally, as were other members of the family. The Jubilee Group has been approached for help with finding out about other members of the Warne and related families —

Can anyone please share memories of Mary Tavy with me? My father's family came from the area and I am trying to fill in gaps in my family tree. So far I have discovered:

- Absalom WARNE (my great grandfather) born 1873 lived at No.2, Moorside, Mary Tavy.(just up from the Royal Standard) He died 1913. His wife was Fanny Augusta WARNE nee Westcott (my great grandmother) born 1874, died 1937.
- Their sons were William (Bill), Frank and Jack WARNE and daughter Elsie WARNE.
- William WARNE married Mary THOMAS and ran the Royal Standard Inn. He was known for his shooting skills.
- Jack WARNE married Vera? and had a daughter Sylvia. They lived at 2, Moorside next door to Madge at number 1 and had a smallholding with livestock.
- Frank WARNE sadly died before WW2.
- Elsie WARNE married Albin COLEMAN (my grandfather) in 1919 and he moved in to Moorside Cottages.
- Absalom Bill and Jack WARNE, at one time, went to the Gold Coast to start a gold mine.
- Albin COLEMAN, Elsie's husband, ran a shoe repair shop from a shed at the end of Warne Lane before moving with his family to Market Street, Tavistock, to open a shoe repair shop, staying there for about 22 years from 1920.
- William (Bill) and Mary WARNE had two sons, one being Christopher.

Any information would be gratefully received. Thank you for taking the time to read through this.

I would like to start by thanking everyone who has given their support to this project, from offers of help and advice to simple words of encouragement. After particular help and guidance from the planners at the National Park we are nearing an agreement with the Trustees of the Recreation Ground over how the site can be laid out and how it is to be run. We then plan to hold a public meeting early in the New Year to outline our plans and to answer any questions which people may have.

Whilst we do not anticipate that everything we plan will be in place for some time yet, it is looking hopeful that we will have progressed to the point where the site will be enclosed and we can be digging for next spring.

Through the coming year we plan to add raised beds for community growing and a communal shed which will provide storage and a place to shelter from the weather. It will also be a place for community members to

meet and discuss ideas on gardening and where growers can in time share their surplus crops. Including these facilities will need us to raise funds through grant applications. Expressions of interest have already been made to a number of grant providers. We will wait to see where they take us.

One of our prime objectives in starting our allotment association is to promote healthy living within our community and encourage people to enjoy the outdoors whilst improving their health. Once we're established we plan to offer gardeners a range of learning activities within the community gardens, aimed particularly at beginners or those wishing to develop existing skills. Please feel free to come along and see what we're doing, get involved, ask questions or share wisdom and knowledge. You will be more than welcome.

Mary Tavy Parish Council

I am very pleased to report that recently MTPC was approached by a parishioner wishing to be considered for co-option on the Council. As you are all undoubtedly aware the current Council has been unable to operate at full strength, although always quorate, from the time Councillors took office in 2015. Having raised our number to 6 when Councillor Graham Ross joined us, also via the co-option process, we had almost resigned ourselves to remaining under strength for the duration of the life of the Council. Therefore, having received this unexpectedly good news we have expedited the appointment process and, after receiving a written application and conducting an informal interview, it has been agreed that the applicant, Mr. John Bright, should be inducted and he has duly become our 7th member. MTPC should have a full strength of 9 Councillors and as we have 2 further vacancies anyone interested in working for their community should record their interest with Mrs. Kerri Higham, our Parish Clerk. As has been pointed out before applicants should be aware that the position of Parish Councillor has little kudos and requires a great deal more from an applicant than attending a monthly Council meeting.

Once again the bonfire night celebrations held on the Victory Memorial Recreation Ground were a great success. This is the 5th time such a celebration of the historical events of 1605 has been put on free of charge for the local and wider community. This year's attendance was greater than ever with over 500 people present and is of course organised by the Mary Tavy Jubilee Group and the Trustees of the Victory Memorial Recreation Ground. Some parishioners will have noted that most of the members of Mary Tavy Parish Council were present taking an active role in the proceedings but acting in their alternative roles as Trustees. Such complex events as this require a great deal of voluntary labour which is not always easy to find. If you enjoyed the celebrations this year perhaps you will step forward to help the organisers with next year's celebration. It has to be said that this shortage of people prepared to be involved in local affairs and voluntary organisations is not a positive sign for the future of our community.

For parishioners who have been wondering what the next stage will be with the current furore over headstone inscriptions and flower pots in the parish cemetery, I am able to tell you that your Parish Council has agreed to again review its published Cemetery Regulations. This action is being taken despite the fact that they have been reviewed and amended 3 times in the previous 2 years. A formal committee meeting will be held shortly after Councillors have had the opportunity to read and digest the content of the detailed 14page Briefing Report presented to them by the Chairman of the Cemetery Committee. Councillors take this matter very seriously and after full discussion and proper consideration their decision will be made known to both the aggrieved parties and the wider community.

The Remembrance Sunday ceremony on the 12th November was, as last year, extremely well attended. Once again we were fortunate with the weather although a sharp wind encouraged a rapid retreat to the Methodist Hall and Chapel once the ceremony had been completed. The parish wreath was laid by the current Chairman of the Parish Council, Councillor John Hill. Our sincere thanks go to those who attended and in particular Reverend Paul Smith of the Methodist circuit who led the religious ceremony and took the non-denominational service which followed it. Next year should of course be the turn of the Rector of Mary Tavy to take the Remembrance Service and we can only hope that by that time the church authorities will have appointed a replacement for the late and much missed Reverend John Higman. Special mention must also be made of our Parish Clerk and her team of helpers for producing the very welcome tea and refreshments which followed the service and to her husband, PC Chris Higham, who stopped the near constant roar of traffic from the A386 for the 2 minutes' silence. To view the congregation which ranged from young children through to the senior members of our parish interspersed with members of the Armed Forces in full uniform and medals was deeply impressive and served to remind us all of the common bond we share of gratitude to those who made the ultimate sacrifice to protect our freedom.

towards the Mary Tavy Childrens Play Area Fund.


We've added metric measurements to make life easier for today's cooks.

FARMHOUSE MINCEMEAT CAKE

5 oz (140g) Butter or Block Margarine 5 oz (140g) Soft Brown Sugar 3 Eggs - size 3 8 oz (227g) S.R. Wholemeal Flour 1 tsp Mixed Spice 1/4 pint (140ml) Apple Juice 11 oz (312g) Mincemeat 2 oz (57g) Flaked Almonds (optional) 3 oz (85g) Glace Cherries

Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease and flour an 8 inch (20cm) cake tin. Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat eggs in one at a time. Fold in flour and mixed spice followed by apple juice, mincemeat, almonds and 2 oz cherries. Place mixture in tin, level top and decorate with remaining cherries and a few almonds. Place in oven and bake for 1¹/4 - 1¹/2 hours. Leave in tin to cool.

There have been lots of sporting events this term; a football tournament at Gulworthy; a Tag Rugby event for year 3 and 4; multiskills events for year 2 and year 3; a cross-country race at Castle Drogo for Key Stage 2 children.
