We're not sure if there will be a separate name for the road, but we'll keep you informed.

Jessica Davis of Harrington Homes has also told us:

I am sure readers and those locally will have noticed the level of work being undertaken on site, currently there is a large attenuation tank being installed on the site, this is to help alleviate the flow of excess surface water that would be collected over the site. We are anticipating to launch the site around mid-September, however, we will of course keep you updated as we progress.

On the day of the WI Spring Sale, when there was also a garden in the village open for charity, it was found that the developer had put banners on the fencing making it impossible to see up the road from the Coronation Hall lane. Unsure what else could be done, the Police were called and they advised that the banners be taken down, which was duly done for the sake of safety. The Jubilee Group contacted Harrington Homes to let them know what had happened and, more importantly, why. They then rearranged the fencing so that the banners could be placed further back to avoid further problems with visibility.

Much of the wood had become rotten. It was painted three years ago when the Jubilee Group arranged a session to get the play area up to standard and open again after it had been closed for a year. But since then the frame had become so rotten that it was dangerous.

The Trustees of the Recreation Ground are considering what to put in to replace it.

## Personal Advertisment by Roger Page (The Pool Guy)

This is an advertisement by Roger Page in a personal capacity and not acting as a member of the Parish Council.

In the previous note on the Parish Council proceedings, you will recall that there was disagreement on the Council related to allotments, payments to a councillor and information flow to you, the parishioners, who pay the council tax to obtain your local services.

Whilst the road to agreement on these topics has not been easy, I believe we have now solved or are now on course to secure agreement.

Firstly, the request for payment to a councillor was paid and unfortunately together with the other problems resulted in the resignation of the councillor. His valuable opinions are a loss to the Council.

Secondly, information flow to you via a page in the Jubilee News was cancelled by mutual consent, leaving the parish notice board as the main source of Council information. However there is always news from Council meetings reported in the Jubilee News and I am using this space to ensure you have a good understanding of what is going on.

Thirdly, much time and effort has been expended in trying to find a solution to the problems discussed in the last Newsletter related to fulfilling the desire for allotments, along with a request for a large grant which is above the limit we are legally able to give. I believe we are now on the way to finding a solution which fulfils this, and at a reasonable cost to the parish.

A working party has been formed so that allotments can be created on land owned by the Parish but which will be managed by the Allotment Association. Several potential consequences have still to be resolved, such as planning regulations and the effect on Bonfire Night, and the cost to the Parish needs to be reduced. Compromises may be necessary, but I am confident that I will be able to report agreement by the time the next newsletter is produced.

Lack of a Parish Clerk has disrupted the proper recording of the proceedings of the Parish Council, but with the appointment of Shane Honey as a temporary clerk, a much improved meeting organisation has already been achieved. Interviews for a permanent Clerk are being organised.

### **Bursting into bloom**

As the allotments project nears realisation it seems an appropriate time to outline what we as an Association hope to achieve, as well as address some of the concerns that have apparently been raised.

Work on the Recreation Ground site to make the ground ready has started. We have 11 plots allocated, and hope to have a couple more available. There will also be an area for smaller community raised beds and a community polytunnel.

We have agreed with the trustees to have one communal shed rather than small individual ones, but it will not have a toilet block, neither do we intend to hold cooking lessons in it. There will be no additional cost to the village as the Parish Council has allocated existing funds to establish the site. The community shed and polytunnel will be funded by grants from elsewhere.

We want the site to become an asset for the village. We also expect it to become very productive over time. We're looking at ways of sharing excess produce with others, particularly those most in need. Talks are ongoing, but if anyone has any suggestion or if you're interested in an allotment or a community plot, please get in touch.

### **Dartmoor Historic Building Restoration Grants**

The Historic Building Restoration Grant is being piloted in Dartmoor as well as four other National Parks with £2 million of funding available.

The aim of the scheme is to help save iconic historic farm buildings in National Parks. Owners can apply for a grant offering 80% towards the cost of restoration, which can include replacing the roof, weatherproofing the



exterior, or other restoration works so that the building can be used again for farming. The grant is also supported by an implementation plan so that applicants can work with National Park advisors on developing a management plan, which is 100% funded.

While most of the historic farm buildings date from the 19th century, Dartmoor has one of the highest concentrations of 17th century and earlier farmstead buildings in England.

We reported in the previous issue that the Reading Rooms was to be refurbished and upgraded.


The Jubilee Group has offered a donation of £500 to the Reading Rooms, specifically for tables. Currently there is just one large table (actually a table tennis table) in the meeting room, but if it is to become more appropriate as a space for a variety of activities, smaller tables which can give a flexible arrangement will be important.

The Jubilee Group has also offered to help with providing items from the heritage collection to provide interest around the walls.

Work is currently underway, with wiring being tidied, walls painted, and a new carpet will be laid. Trees have been taken down at the front of the building and the outside is to be given a facelift.

The funds for the Jubilee Group's donation come from profits made on Bonfire Nights over the past five years. From the most recent Bonfire Night the Jubilee Group has also given donations to the Coronation Hall and St.Luke's Hospice.

# Do you have any connections with the Mallett family?

The Mallett (also spelt as Malet or Mallet) family are seeking to trace their family line in and around Tavistock, and have set up a DNA study to establish whether branches of the family are biologically related.

There is known to be one current Mary Tavy resident who is a descendant from the South Tawton Mallet family and in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries there were serveral Mallet generations in Mary Tavy.

They are seeking a male member of a Mallett family to take part and provide a DNA sample.

John Isaac Mallett 1846 – 1928

John Isaac Mallett was born in Tavistock, then is shown on the census from 1871 as living in Mary Tavy, the same year he married Priscilla James. They lived at Wortha Mill, Blackdown, Palmers Corner, and he died at Moorside. His occupation is shown as labourer, miner, and a worker for GWR including as a platelayer.

## Change of arrangements for Bonfire Night

Yes it is a little early in the year to be talking about Bonfire Night, but we need to make the community aware of a change that will be taking place this year.

Bonfire Night started as a Jubilee Group concept following the Jubilee Beacon Bonfire and it has grown into a very successful village event, not only helping to bring the village together but also to raise the profile of Mary Tavy.

Thanks to generous sponsors, large numbers of people kindly giving time and expertise to run Bonfire Night, plus the support of everyone who has come along to enjoy the event, Bonfire Night has raised funds each year even though it is free to attend. The success of Bonfire Night has meant that funds have been able to go towards other village projects.

Initially the Jubilee Group ran Bonfire Night alone but a few years ago we invited the Recreation Ground to become joint organisers. This year the Recreation Ground Trustees have decided, unilaterally, to take over Bonfire Night as its own project. It is the Jubilee Group's philosophy to get projects started that can then be run independently, and it frees up the Jubilee Group Trustees and helpers to set up other village events and projects which we have had to put on the back boiler due to a shortage of time and energy.

We hope the Recreation Ground Trustees invest the large amounts of time and effort needed each year to make sure that this successful free village event goes from strength to strength.

We hope too that we might be able to count on the help and support of many in the community for new Jubilee Group projects, and if you have any proposals or ideas to put forward for new events please do let us know.

We'd like to take this opportunity to say a really big thank you to John Thacker and his team for the wonderful firework display each year. John has decided, having left Mary Tavy four years ago, that the time has come to move on to other things, and possibly take a long winter holiday.

## No shortage of rubbish

On a slightly wet Sunday in April, eighteen intrepid members of the community turned out for the Litter Pick, organised by the Jubilee Group. They filled more than 20 bags. Amongst the general rubbish there were many 'used' dog poo bags, cans, lots of coffee cups with lids, several hub caps and a huge section of the front of a car.

We'd like to say thank you to the Coronation Hall for providing the kitchen and meeting room without charge, and at the same time we'd like to apologise to them that the arrangement we'd made with WDBC hadn't been followed through by them, and the rubbish remained outside the hall for longer than it should have done. Thanks too go to the Mary Tavy and Peter Tavy WI who provided tea and excellent cakes at the end of the afternoon's efforts. The Jubilee Group made a donation to the WI, and some of that money will be used to enhance the planting area on the corner of the A386 and Bal Lane.

The Jubilee Group has purchased equipment, and some pickers have been donated, so we are well set up to undertake more frequent litter picks in the future, and keep our village clear of rubbish.


the Prince and his bride might like. Class 1 made wedding cards with messages inside for Prince Harry and Meghan. We wish them a long and happy life together.


