A lot is happening at the allotments

Things on the allotments have progressed quickly since the fence went up in early February. Most of us have started to get things in the ground, despite the weather and buds are showing on fruit bushes and trees. As we hoped, large numbers of passers-by want to stop and chat over the fence about our plans. Almost all of the comments have been positive and helpful. I'm even having chats with people from outside the village who have heard of us or have seen our site when driving past.



We now have almost everything we need in place. People have been incredibly generous with their time or resources. Our thanks to George Hill for doing so much to help us including turning the soil, to local businesses for providing bark chippings, muck, timber and much more. Our community shed is due to arrive very soon thanks to a grant from Devon County Council. There is still a bit of work to be done to bring water to the site but hopefully we can achieve this soon courtesy of a company from Launceston who have been working locally.

We have grant applications in for the materials we need in order to provide the small community beds and we still have two half plots available, although we may take a leaf out of another society's book and reduce those further to offer starter plots.

All we need now is some good weather!

DCC Highways and SWW have carried out investigations into this latest problem and believe it is a natural spring which has found a weak point and is pushing through the road. DCC Highways plan to redirect the spring water into the sewerage system and expect work to take place this summer.





Personal Advertisment by Roger Page (The Pool Guy)

This is an advertisement by Roger Page in a personal capacity and not acting as a member of the Parish Council.

We are fast approaching the time when you, the Mary Tavy parishioners must decide who will be your elected representatives on the Parish Council. Several of the present councillors have informed a meeting on 24th February that they will not be standing for the next council. I think that this is good news for the parish, although it will be difficult to reverse some of the mistakes carried through by the present council.

Two of the easiest mistakes will be to reinstate proper scrutiny of the planning applications and proper financial control of the parish finances by reinstating the Planning and Finance sub-committees, both of which were abolished to enable individual schemes to be passed.

Another which will help to reduce costs will be to employ a permanent Clerk to the Council, who can deliver improved advice to the council at a cost of £8 per hour less than that of the current locum clerk and who will hopefully not need travel expenses from near Exeter for each visit.

Many of you will have noted that a large section of the Recreation Ground has been fenced off for the benefit of 10 allotment holders, whilst excluding the 1550 parishioners with no allotment. This unfair decision was taken by 4 councillors including the 3 members of the Recreation Ground Trust and one also the Secretary of the Allotment Association. The Parish Council paid for the fence and for chemicals and fertiliser for the allotments

Those same councillors have voted to set a budget for Parish Council Tax for 2019/20 with an increase of 23% cost to you to cover these mistakes and to continue in the same vein. We desperately need Mary Tavy electors of all ages and sexes to stand as Parish Councillors to stop the sort of practices carried out by the present council. No experience is required and training will be given.

Please, those who love Mary Tavy and would like to stop the nonsensical decisions being taken and who view the Parish from an individual perspective, apply urgently. (The final date for nomination, to be received at Council Offices, is 3rd April.)

Let's take back control of our Parish!
